RESPONSE TO THE SHOW CAUSE ORDER

Comes Now, William M. Windsor (“Windsor”) and files this Response to the Show Cause Order. Windsor shows the Court as follows:

1. The Show Cause Order received May 5, 2011 required Windsor to appear before this Court on May 13, 2011; that hearing was postponed. The Show Cause Order accuses Windsor of forgery – a criminal matter.

2. The Show Cause Order CLEARLY is about forgery, a criminal offense. Yet, Judge Duffey entered an order on May 9, 2011 that claims to the contrary. A Show Cause Order must specify quite clearly what it is that those ordered to show cause must prove. Windsor does not have a clue. Therefore, the hearing must be canceled and/or the Show Cause Order must be amended to

specify exactly what it is that should be proven. Windsor must then be given time to file a response.

3. This Court has not granted Windsor the rights he is owed under the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure.

4. As the Show Cause Order is threatening criminal penalties, a jury trial is demanded. Judge Duffey has demonstrated pervasive bias. He is threatening to send Windsor to jail. This is personal to him. The only possible way there can be a fair trial is if there is a jury and/or a different judge.

5. By law, the Court must request that the contempt be prosecuted by an attorney for the government. This has not been done. Windsor would like to speak with this person. (See generally *Cromer v. Kraft Foods North America, Incorporated*, No. 02-1646 (4th Cir. 12/08/2004); *Miller v. Donald*, 541 F.3d 1091 (11th Cir. 08/29/2008).)

6. Windsor asks that Judge Duffey recuse himself.

7. Judge Duffey will be a key witness in this hearing/trial, and this issue involves severe criticism of Judge Duffey as a judge. As a result, he is disqualified from presiding at the trial and hearings unless Windsor consents, and he does not consent. (See *Caperton v. A. T. Massey Coal Co., Inc.*, 129 S.Ct. 2252, 173 L.Ed.2d 1208 (U.S. 06/08/2009).)

8. Windsor demands that Judge Duffey issue subpoenas so Windsor may subpoena witnesses.

9. Rule 3 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure requires that the complaint be a written statement of the essential facts constituting the offense charged. It must be made under oath before a magistrate judge or, if none is reasonably available, before a state or local judicial officer. Windsor has not received this. The Hearing cannot be held.

10. Windsor has not been served with a Summons as per Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure. The Hearing cannot be held.

11. A Preliminary Hearing must be held as required by Rule 5.1 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure. The Hearing cannot be held.

12. A Pretrial Conference has not been held as per Rule 17.1 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure. The Hearing cannot be held.

13. On May 6, 2011, all members of the Fulton County Grand Jury were presented with criminal charges against Judge William S. Duffey during their session at the Fulton County Grand Jury Room in the office of the District Attorney.

14. Access to the Grand Jury was authorized by the Office of the Fulton County District Attorney following communication between Windsor and Mr. Paul Howard, Jr.

15. Windsor has filed two civil actions against Judge Duffey in the Fulton County Superior Court. One of the actions charges Judge Duffey with the violation of the Georgia RICO statute and many Georgia criminal statute violations as predicate acts.

16. Judge Duffey has continually made rulings that violate the law and constitute criminal acts.

17. Judge William S. Duffey has shown pervasive bias in this matter, and this formal filing of criminal charges against him makes it impossible for Judge Duffey to continue to preside in this matter.

18. Windsor needs to subpoena witnesses for the hearing. The Clerk of the Court ignores or denies Windsor's requests for subpoenas, and Windsor has no authority to require witnesses to appear.

19. This Court must order the Clerk of the Court to provide signed subpoenas for depositions and appearance at the hearing.

WHEREFORE, Windsor prays that this Court grant this request and that this Court do as follows: grant the request for approval to file a motion to order the Clerk of the Court to allow Windsor to file a response to the Show Cause Order; and grant such other relief as the Court deems appropriate.
