Dear Mr. William Windsor,

The State is in receipt of your two letters dated April 22, 2015 and your two letters dated April 23, 2015. Be advised discovery was sent to your standby counsel Chris Daly. Please arrange printing through him. Jail policy, as you know, does not allow for laptops.

This is a criminal proceeding you are not entitled nor will the State agree to depositions. While you, with the authorization of the Court, have the right to interview witnesses the State intends to call, you do not have the right to depose them. Be reminded, the Judge Haynes instructed you that any requests for interviews are to be arranged with his authorization.

Regarding your other requests, including having a production company film the trial, cellphones, security, and potential filming at the prison, be advised of the following: with the exception of one, your requests fall squarely within the province of the Court. Courtroom recording, cell phones, and security arrangement are at the discretion of the Court. The State will object to a production company filming the trial. Any requests for filming at the Montana State Prison should appropriately be directed to the Montana Department of Corrections.

A response to your motions was filed. The State does not believe a hearing is necessary and will not request one. Although you indicated you filed a Motion to Recuse, such a motion has not been received by the Clerk of Court. The State will likely oppose any Motion to Recuse

Regarding your April 23rd letter, the State will not approach the Judge regarding bond conditions. The State believes the conditions are appropriate and properly related to the charged offenses.

Additionally, you asked about proper procedure for filing in light of the Omnibus Form being filed. The State is not comfortable advising you on how to proceed with your defense. All such questions should be addressed to Mr. Daly.
