IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

The Grand Jurors, duly selected, organized, sworn and impaneled as such for the County of Ellis, State of Texas, at the July 2019 Term of the 443rd Judicial District Court for said County, upon their oaths present in and to said Court that on or about June 10, 2019, and before the presentment of this indictment, in the County and State aforesaid, JOHN ERIC ARMSTRONG did then and there knowingly engage in conduct directed specifically toward Stephanie Kersh that the defendant knew or reasonably believed the said Stephanie Kersh would regard as threatening bodily injury or death to the said Stephanie Kersch, to-wit: going to Stephanie Kersch's home after being told to stay away and/or sending her a letter advising her life was in danger, and the defendant's said conduct would cause a reasonable person to fear, and did cause the said Stephanie Kersch to fear, bodily injury or death for the said Stephanie Kersh,

And it is further presented in and to said Court, that on or about June 3, 2019, in said County and State, the defendant did then and there knowingly engage in conduct directed specifically toward the said Stephanie Kersh, to wit: showing up at her residence and professing his love for her in which she responded by telling him he was not welcome at her house and to leave,

And it is further presented in and to said Court, that on June 9, 2019, in said County and State, the defendant did then and there knowingly engage in conduct directed specifically toward the said Stephanie Kersh, to wit: showing up at her residence and apologizing, he was again told he was not welcome at her house,

And it is further presented in and to said Court, that on July 7, 2019, in said County and State, the defendant did then and there knowingly engage in conduct directed specifically toward the said Stephanie Kersh, to wit: showing up to her residence,

And it is further presented in and to said Court, that on November 7, 2019, in said County and State, the defendant did then and there knowingly engage in conduct directed specifically toward the said Stephanie Kersh, to wit: sending her a 14 page letter that described her life being in danger and that the Sheriff would probably attempt to have her killed and frame him for it, as well as describing that God was telling him to do these things and it was okay if he went to jail for it,

And it is further presented in and to said Court, that each of the foregoing acts was committed pursuant to the same scheme or course of conduct that was directed specifically at Stephanie Kersh,
