ORDER

This is a pro se civil action. It is before the Court on the Plaintiff's Motion for Leave to File Guardianship Actions and Appeals [Doc. 263]. The Plaintiff's extraordinary abuse of the judicial process through overly burdensome, vexatious, and frivolous litigiousness led the Court to impose the filing restrictions set forth in the Court's Order of February 12, 2018. The current motion seeks to vacate that Order and to allow the Plaintiff to proceed with appeals of an action pending in the Texas Tenth Court of Appeals. The motion, which fails to comply with the Court's Local Rules, shows that Mr. Windsor's extraordinary abuse of the judicial process is continuing. It appears that he is engaged in the unauthorized practice of law. The Court declines the invitation to intervene in the matter pending in the Texas Tenth

Court of Appeals. The Plaintiff's Motion for Leave to File Guardianship Actions and Appeals [Doc. 263] is DENIED.
